• SENIORS – SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION:

Please pick up an updated scholarship listing in the Guidance Office. There are many local scholarships worth thousands of dollars that are coming due very soon! Get into the Guidance Office ASAP and remember that your guidance counselor needs one week's notice for letters of recommendation.

• The deadline for Clarkston Education Foundation Scholarships (including letters of recommendation) is April 10. If you are mailing your scholarship application in, please note that it must be RECEIVED by the Foundation by April 10th. Also, the Betty and Owen Stickle Scholarship is open to ALL students – not just those who attend the Clarkston Methodist Church. The Stickle Scholarship is a very large, local scholarship that is due on March 22nd. Pick up the application in the Guidance Office. The Kramer 2-Sport Athlete Scholarship will not be offered this year.

Seniors – the Asotin County Cattle Women, Cattlemen & Wheat Growers have several scholarships available for graduating Seniors. These scholarships are for students interested in pursuing a career in Agriculture or any Family and Consumer Science related field, and are residents of Asotin County. Please see Ms. Browne or Ms. Romesburg for an application, which is due Friday, March 29th.

WWCC has STEM Scholarships available for students wanting to enter the fields of Energy Systems Technology, Engineering, Plant and Soil Science, or Watershed management.
